Nik Gowing founded the Thinking the Unthinkable project in 2014. He is co-author of Thinking the Unthinkable (2018) and Director of Think Unthinkable Ltd. Nik was a main news presenter for the BBC's international 24-hour news channel BBC World News 1996-2014. He presented The Hub with Nik Gowing, BBC World Debates, Dateline London, plus location coverage of major global stories. He spent 18 years at ITN in senior roles including bureau chief in Rome and Warsaw, plus Diplomatic Editor, Channel 4 New. He collected a prestigous BAFTA award in 1982 for his coverage of martial law in Poland. He holds degrees from the Universities of Cape Town (BA Hons) and Lancaster (MA cum laude, and PhD), and was, first, the Director of Studies and then the National Director of the SA Institute of International Affairs from 1994-2005. With Brenthurst he has directed numerous reform projects with African heads of state, including Rwanda (2007-8), Mozambique (2005-11), Swaziland (2010-11), Malawi (2012-14, and again 2020/1), Kenya (2012 and 2020), Lesotho (2008;2019-20), Liberia (2006/7), Zambia (2010 2016), Zimbabwe (2009-13), Ghana (2017), Ethiopia (2019- 20), Nigeria (2017-18), and almost continuously at various levels of government in South Africa from the Foundation's outset. He also sat on the Danish Africa Commission and on the African Development Bank's high-level panel on fragile states, and served four deployments to Afghanistan with the British Army as the adviser to the commander. He has also worked extensively in Colombia, and with a variety of African governments in both improving the conditions for peacebuilding and investment, including through the Zambezi Protocol on the natural resource sector. A member of the advisory board of the Royal United Services Institute, he is the author of the best-selling books Why Africa Is Poor and Africa's Third Liberation, and together with President Olusegun Obasanjo Making Africa Work: A Handbook for Economic Success. In 2018 he completed a second stint as a visiting fellow at Cambridge University, in producing a book on the state of African democracy, which was published as Democracy Works in 2019. The Asian Aspiration: Why

and How Africa Should Emulate Asia (again with President Obasanjo and former Ethiopian Prime Minister Hailemariam Desalegn) followed in 2020, which identifies the relevant lessons from Asia's development and growth story. His writings won him the Recht Malan Prize for Non-Fiction Work in South Africa. His latest books - Expensive Poverty - which details the failings of aid, and suggests several ways to improve development outcomes, was published by Pan Macmillan in October 2021 while The Ledger: Accounting for Failure in Afghanistan was published by Hurst/Oxford University Press at the start of 2022. An edited compendium on Better Choices for the South African economy was also published by Pan Macmillan in March 2022, another on Populism in August 2022 and a volume on South African scenarios The Good, the Bad and the Ugly in August 2023. Advisor to the President of the Kurdistan Region





Safeen Ghafour is a Senior Executive Advisor for Public Sector Reform who has worked at the Cabinet level within the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) for over a decade. During this period, the Kurdistan Region has navigated serious challenges—including ISIS, the COVID-19 pandemic, economic migration, waves of displacement, and financial crises. Reporting directly to the Deputy Prime Minister, he leads the flagship public service reform initiative—*The Services Portal*—transforming how citizens access government services. He also led the Biometric Registration Program, delivering significant cost savings and building a centralised system for over a million wage-earners that introduced the Unique Person Number (UPN) to streamline payroll and service delivery. Safeen has long championed open-source software and IT excellence across Kurdistan and Europe. A former developer, he co-founded *Kurditgroup*, the first Kurdish IT professionals' network, and *The Foundation Hub*, a coworking and entrepreneurship incubator in Slemani. He pioneered the first Kurdish Unicode font and keyboard layouts for digital communication. He holds master's degrees from the University of Queensland and Universiteit Utrecht.

Qubad Talabani

Deputy Prime Minister, Kurdistan Regional Government



Qubad Talabani is the Deputy Prime Minister of the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG). Running on a platform of stability, jobs and improved services in the 2018 Kurdistan region parliamentary elections, Talabani won more votes than any other candidate in Iraq. He was first sworn in as Deputy Prime Minister of the Eighth KRG Cabinet in June 2014, where he took office during an immensely difficult time. Receiving no fiscal transfers from the Government of Iraq (GoI), coupled with rapidly declining oil prices, the Kurdistan region was in the midst of a severe financial crisis. Moreover, the Islamic State was rampaging its way throughout Iraq, claiming territory and establishing itself as one of history's most brutal terrorist organizations, resulting in a major humanitarian crisis that forced 1.8 million people to flee war and violence and seek refuge in the Kurdistan region. During this period, the KRG successfully oversaw a package of reforms. A major part of the KRG's economic reform plan included improving oversight of government expenditures. To that end, Talabani successfully oversaw the design and implementation of his government's biometric registration program. This system aimed at eliminating ghost employees and right-sizing the government, helped to remove 50,000 fake jobs, which saved the KRG millions of dollars monthly. In a period of

six months, 1.2 million people were registered in the biometric registration system. Talabani also launched the KRG's services portal, aimed at streamlining government services and citizens interactions with the government. During the KRG's Seventh Cabinet, Talabani established and headed up the Department of Coordination and Follow-up to facilitate interministerial coordination and ensure that decrees are effectively implemented. He directed that KRG agency on behalf of the Prime Minister for two years. Prior to his return to the Kurdistan region's capital Erbil, starting in 2000, Talabani served in the KRG's representation office in the United States. He was appointed the KRG Representative to the US after the Government's unification in 2006, a position he held until his departure in 2012. While Talabani served as the KRG's top diplomat in the US, the representation office was recognized by many as Kurdistan's de-facto embassy in Washington, DC. During Talabani's posting, the KRG representation in the US deepened Kurdistan's relations with both the executive and legislative branches of the US government. Among other successes, Talabani launched the Kurdish American Congressional Caucus, a bipartisan caucus that in 2011 was formally supported by fifty-two members of Congress. The caucus, established in May 2008, now symbolizes continued amity and cooperation between the United States and Kurdish Americans as well as the people of the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. During his tenure as the KRG representative to the US, Mr. Talabani was also instrumental in the formation of the United States Kurdistan Business Council (USKBC), in November 2011. The USKBC is dedicated to facilitating trade and commerce for U.S. companies in the Kurdistan Region and strengthening ties between the private sector in the U.S. and the Kurdistan Region. The USKBC also works closely with the KRG to ensure that foreign investment provides needed value and benefit to the region and is made in such a way as to reinforce and strengthen the already enormous economic opportunities there. Talabani also strengthened Kurdish grassroots activities and engaged the Kurdish American community in shaping US policy. This included mobilizing the Kurdish community in the US, and the Kurdish American Congressional Caucus to pass legislation calling on the State Department to open a US Consulate in the Kurdistan Region. After Operation Iraqi Freedom in the spring of 2003, Talabani was named Senior Foreign Relations officer of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan (PUK), operating mainly out of Baghdad and Suleimani. There, he worked closely with the American-led Coalition Office of Reconstruction and Humanitarian Assistance, serving as the PUK's top liaison to the Coalition Provisional Authority and to US forces in Iraq. Talabani was also a key negotiator in drafting the Transitional Administrative Law, the forerunner to the current Constitution of Iraq. Following high school, Talabani took a keen interest in engineering. He obtained a Diploma in Motor Vehicle Engineering at Carshalton College and later received a **B.Sc.** in Mechanical Engineering (majoring in Automotive Systems Engineering) at Kingston University in Greater London. Deputy Prime Minister Talabani was born in 1977. He was raised in the United Kingdom by his maternal grandparents, Ibrahim

Ahmed, a novelist, poet and founder of the modern intellectual Kurdish movement, and Galawejh Ahmed, also a novelist. His family has been involved in Kurdish politics for decades. His father, Jalal Talabani, was the President of the Republic of Iraq from 2006 until 2014. Deputy Prime Minister Talabani lives with his wife Sherri and their two children, Ari and Lara, in Erbil. He is fluent in Kurdish and English. Mr. Talabani is a football fan and an enthusiastic supporter of Manchester United.

Shanaz Amer Badran





Fanis Papathanasiou




